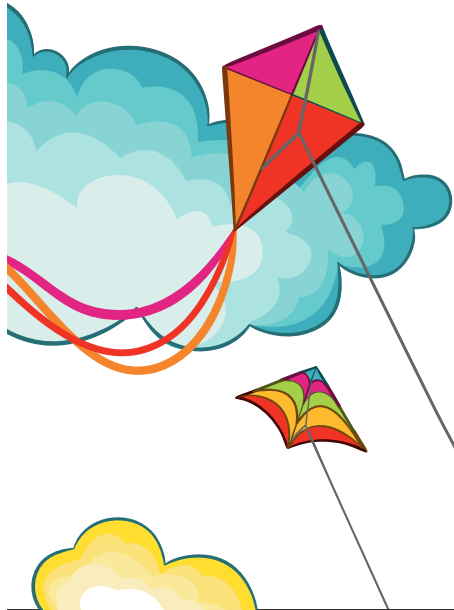

Week Three

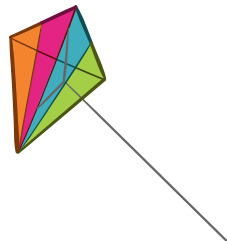
Acts 2:42-47

DAILY CUES



Morning Time

When you go into your child's room, say, “Good morning! We have SO much to celebrate because Jesus is alive and He wants to be our friend forever!”



Drive Time

As you drive or take a walk, talk about how Jesus did special things for His friends, the disciples, like make them breakfast on a beach. Next, talk about things you both can do to be a good friend. Jesus wants to be our friend forever and He wants us to be a good friend, too.



Cuddle Time

Cuddle with your child this month and pray, “Dear God, [name of child] and I want to love people the way Jesus taught us to love people. Please help us see the needs of others and be willing to share our clothes, food, and home to help others. Thank You for giving us Jesus to be our friend forever, and teach us how to be a good friend. We love You, God. In Jesus' name, amen.”



Bath Time

Grab some bath crayons and take turns drawing pictures on the tub. Each time one of you draws a picture, tell each other all about it. As you dry your child off, tell them that Jesus has something He wants us to go and tell. Jesus wants us to go and tell everyone everywhere that He loves them and He wants to be their friend forever!

Theme

Jump, Jump



Week One

Genesis 1:31; 2:8-3:24

God creates the world and puts Adam and Eve in a garden, but they do not go God's way.

Week Two

Jonah 1:1-3:10

Jonah learns the hard way that he should go God's way when he is swallowed by a huge fish.

Week Three

2 Kings 5:1-14

Naaman chooses to go God's way and dip in the river, even though it is hard to do.

Week Four

2 Chronicles 34

King Josiah tells others to go God's way, even though he is young.

Week Five

Judges 7:1-8

Gideon trusts that God's way is perfect, even though it does not make sense at the time.

Say This

Whose way is perfect?
God's way is perfect.

DAILY CUES



Morning Time

When you go into your child's room, say, "Good morning! Who's ready to wake up and go God's way?"



Drive Time

As you drive or take a walk, tell your child which way you need to go in order to get where you're going. Ask your child what would happen if you went the wrong way. (You would not get where you need to go.) Talk about how God's way is perfect. That means God's way is never ever wrong. God's way will always be the best way and will get us where God wants us to go.



Cuddle Time

Cuddle with your child this month and pray, "Dear God, Your way is always perfect. That means Your way will always be the right way. Help us to know what Your way is and then choose to go Your way. We love You, God. In Jesus' name, amen."



Bath Time

Add a toy to bath time. Use a bath crayon to draw an arrow on the tub showing your child which way the toy can go. Wipe away the arrow and draw another one going the opposite direction. Change up the arrow a few times during bath time while your child plays with the toy, making it follow the arrow. Talk about how God tells us the right way to go, too, but it's up to us to choose to go God's way.

Week One

John 3:16

We can trust God because He loves us so much He gave us His Son, Jesus, to be our friend forever.

Week Two

Joshua 5:13-6:27

Joshua trusts God's plan and obeys, even though it does not make sense to him.

Week Three

Judges 6-8

God uses Gideon to do big things, even though he and his army are small.

Week Four

1 Kings 18

God sends fire on the altar as an answer to Elijah's prayer and shows that He is the one true God.

Say This

Who can trust God?
I can trust God.

Morning Time

When you go into your child's room, say, "Good morning! I want to give my [name of child] a great, big hug because God loves us with a great, big love!"



Drive Time

As you drive or take a walk, take turns saying the two sentences of the memory verse. For example, you say, "I trust in God." And your child says, "I am not afraid." And then you both say, "Psalm 56:11." Now switch and say it all again! Talk about how every person feels afraid sometimes, but when we trust God, we don't have to stay afraid.



Cuddle Time

Cuddle with your child this month and pray, "Dear God, thank You for loving us and using us in Your plan. It doesn't matter how big or small we are. It's all about You and what You can do. And You can use [name of child] and me, no matter what. You are awesome, God, and we love You. In Jesus' name, amen."



Bath Time

As you bathe your child, ask them, "Can you blow bubbles in the water? Can you tap the top of the water with your hands? Can you scoop and pour the water? Can you put your head under the water?" Then say, "Wow! You can do a lot of things. But guess what! God can do ANYTHING! It's true! That's one of the reasons we can trust God. God can do anything!"
