## **Eight Resources for March 8th**

Dear Friends,

Did you know that March 8th is International Women's Day? In fact, March is actually International Women's Month! In El Salvador, it's a month where we take the opportunity to affirm the dignity and worth of the women that we serve. Many women are vulnerable in El Salvador and taking time to not only educate them about their legal rights, but to help them understand what God thinks about them is an important focus of our work this month.

Gender-based violence continues to be an issue and women and girls are heavily affected by poverty, lack of education and other social problems. The current government crackdown on gangs, including mass incarcerations, has left many women as heads of single family homes putting further economic strain on them. Women continue to be vulnerable to intimate partner violence and the schemes of sex traffickers and pimps. Women living on the street are extremely vulnerable to violence, exploitation and substance abuse.

Despite the risks, women in El Salvador are strong and resilient. We are working to offer opportunities for healing, security, and dignified work so that women can be reconciled to God, their families, and their communities. As we celebrate International Women's Day on March 8, we are highlighting **Eight Resources** that we are using to serve women here in El Salvador:

1. Spiritual Nuture: Being reconciled to God through a relationship with Christ is the first step toward healing and reconciliation with others. We offer space for Bible study, prayer, and spiritual encouragement.

2. Case Management: Every women's story is different and requires different attention. Through individual case management we can help women to access resources within our programs, or through outside referrals. 3. Healing in Community: Studies show trauma is healed through social

support and we work to help women take the journey together through support groups and activities that happen in a group setting. **4. Economic Empowerment**: A dignified wage and the opportunity to start her

own business is incredibly healing for women who have survived trafficking, exploitation, and life on the streets. Financial independence is key for reintegration and sustainability and we offer this through the start-up of small businesses and job training. 5. Therapy: Group and individual therapy in addition to interventions for substance abuse and addictive behaviors are resources that we provide for

**6. Workshops**: Through art, exercise, computer classes, sewing, and other workshops women can gain deeper healing, life skills and social support all at the same time!

7. Care: Life on the streets is lonely and violent and by providing practical care through meals, showers, sanitary products, clean clothes, and simply listening we can holistically care for the basic needs of vulnerable women in El

8 You!: Finally, we are able to connect women with donors who care enough to invest in these resources. All of these resources are free to the women who need them and we can't pay the staff salaries, or provide the materials or space without committed donors.




