Introducing Leah Anastasia Mendez Bissett


Our sweet baby girl was born to us on June 17 at 11:52AM in San José, Costa Rica. An answer to many prayers, her birth went smoothly and both mama and baby are healthy. We have enjoyed the first 3 months with Leah, watching her grow, learn and become more active and alert every day. We are so blessed and privileged to be mom and dad to our baby girl and can't wait to watch her grow. Emanuel had one month of paternity leave and has been back at Casa Esperanza for two months now. Susie's last day of maternity leave is Monday the 15th and will be returning to ministry work on Tuesday the 16th.

Emanuel's parents have loved spending time at the house with us. Here are some updates on what's been going on in Casa Esperanza so far in 2025:




Sewing Class

This year we have had five women continue in advanced sewing class, producing skirts, tote bags and aprons. We have also received a handful of new students that start their journey by practicing straight lines, then curvy and zigzag lines on paper. Once they've passed that unit, they move on to practice pieces of cloth. From there, they start to learn how to use patterns, cut and measure fabric, and assembly. We are all very proud of their accomplishments, talents and perseverance with learning the trade. After many hours of dedication, they are able to produce a beautiful product to be sold.

Discipleship Bible Study

This year, Susie and Emanuel started a small group Bible Study with three of our center's women who have shown leadership. Our goal has been to create a safe space to dive into the Word, ask the hard questions, and challenge them as leaders in the community. Emanuel has continued the study while Susie has been on maternity leave. Because the women have not had much experience diving into the Scripture and their highest education level is 6th grade, we have started with teaching them *how* to read and understand the text. Through this, we have seen God transforming their hearts to desire deeper understanding of His Word.



Social Work

In Costa Rica, all university students must complete 150 hours of community service in a space related to their area of study. Every quarter we receive around 10 social work students on Saturdays that serve our women. So while the head social worker meets 1:1 with the women to go over their case and prepare their letters and reports, the students carry out activities, workshops and crafts for the women. They focus on important life topics, such as violence, women's health, legal rights, and emotions. We are so grateful for their support.

Emotional Intelligence

Monday mornings in Casa Esperanza are for Social Emotional Learning. For women facing prostitution or homelessness, daily life can be overwhelming — filled with fear, anger, shame, and survival pressure. Teaching emotional intelligence gives them tools to understand and manage these feelings, build self-worth, and set healthy boundaries. It's more than "managing emotions" — it's helping women rediscover their identity and see new possibilities for their lives. Emanuel has discovered that he really enjoys and has a gift for teaching in this setting because he loves empowering the women with tools and speaking to them about their incredible value in this world.





Looking Ahead

Looking ahead, Susie is excited to return to work and discover the dynamics of a working mom. We will split the work week up, so that Emanuel will stay home with baby Leah while Susie is at Casa Esperanza and vice versa. Susie will continue back with Free The Girls projects with the women: building a store, starting a business, and selling bras at markets. English class will resume for a quick two month quarter at the end of the year. Emanuel will continue with Bible Study and Social-Emotional Learning workshops.

On Wednesday in Casa Esperanza the women come in to share a meal and select 2-3 pieces of clothing from our donations. Wednesdays are hands down the busiest day of our week with 40-50 women coming through and we wouldn't be able to do it without the help of our two Casa Esperanza leaders, Kerry and Grettel! Both women worked in the Red Zone for years. But now, they spend hours of their week preparing the clothing and organizing the closet for Wednesday. During the activity, Kerry and Grettel direct the women to ensure everyone is getting equal amounts of time and clothing. We are so thankful to have such amazing mentors for the women we serve here in Casa Esperanza!

- **Legal Documents:** Pray that Costa Rica gives Susie her Residency this year! We have completed all the steps and are awaiting their response. Pray for Emanuel's U.S. visa possibilities: we waited 18 months for his interview in August just to be denied; we will need wisdom in pursuing other options to get him to visit the U.S.
