Please pray with us for these two boys but also for our team to have wisdom and discernment when these situations arise. That we would follow the Holy Spirit's prompting in how TRU should respond. It isn't easy but we are thankful for the Helper and for your prayers.

We have many things to celebrate as well! TRU has been busy with teams visiting and we are thankful. It is always good to see the ministry through fresh eyes. It is an encouragement to our family and to our team. These teams come to serve the boys and girls of our programs, but also to support our TRU team. We love to share what God is doing in Kenya, but those who visit teach us many things as well! We are blessed.

Our art class on Thursdays is for boys 15 and younger. Most of the boys who are coming are home based, meaning that they have a home but are out on the streets during the day. They aren't going to school because their families can't pay school fees. We are thankful that they are coming to art class, but are praying how TRU can discern how best to help these boys and their families. This group of boys is very attentive during Bible study and is very engaged in creating. We are praying that the gospel pierces their hearts. Pray with us!





God is moving and we are thankful to be a part of it. Our boys and girls programs are growing and we are praying for wisdom and discernment in how to adapt. Our friends Billy and Darleen Honc have started working with TRU in helping expand our discipleship program. There have been multiple baptisms over the last few months. Praise the Lord! The Honcs have started working with a small group of our young ladies who were among those baptized. They are meeting on Tuesdays and Thursdays for in depth bible study and discipleship. We are also celebrating a group of our boys who are getting close to graduating the TRU program! They have gone through drug rehab, through vocational training and are now entering the exiting stage of the program. Finding a job is not easy in a market that is oversaturated and not stable. But praise the Lord! This group of boys are all being proactive and two have already been offered jobs and all four have found housing. Please pray for wisdom and discernment in preparing these boys. Pray for job opportunities and for perseverance in staying sober and in following Christ. Pray that these boys will be disciple makers and leaders in their communities.
