February 24 marked the fourth anniversary of the invasion of Russia into Ukraine, a conflict that continues to bring pain and destruction. It has become the second largest war in Europe since World War II, and in the midst of this reality we have had the privilege of serving thousands of people where God has placed us.

On February 23, we lifted our prayers for peace in Ukraine and Iran, nations suffering ongoing violence and tension. We would like to share with you what God has been doing in his ministry over these past months.

Patrycja started a new initiative in Dom Kultur – a support group for moms with babies and toddlers. It’s a weekly meeting where moms can chat, discuss different topics and support each other in the journey of motherhood while the little ones play together and do simple crafts. So far we welcomed moms from Poland, Lithuania and India. It was a great time to connect and a great time for Timo to meet new friends and be part of the ministry from early on. We pray that after the get to know each other period, we will be able to go deeper - share Jesus and grow in faith together.

Sports Day

Although many know that Roberto isn't exactly the sportiest person on our team—and sports aren't necessarily his best friend—the first weeks back in Poland placed him in a new challenge. We participated in a sports week, a beautiful opportunity to share the love of Jesus with children and young people through activities like volleyball, soccer, and other games. Even though we don't have many men on our team, Roberto stepped up to the challenge, and it became a time full of learning and new friendships. How amazing to see that God can use both our strengths and weaknesses to show His love!

It is beautiful to see how language learning opens the door to deep friendships, safe spaces, and natural moments to share about Jesus. 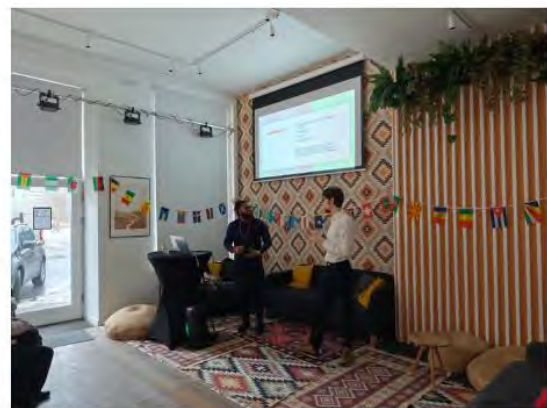
Humanitarian Aid Distribution: Hands That Support
