Let us share with you what we have been up to in the last few months.

Mom and baby club

The group continues to meet every Friday morning. I am very thankful for our friend and teammate Annie who is helping me to prepare and lead the meetings. Timo likes this time a lot and every Friday morning is very keen to get ready and go play with Nini (that's how he calls Annie). We are very thankful for donation that helped us buy more toys – a tool that is necessary when meeting with moms with babies. Please pray with us that more moms would join our group.



Weekly Bible Study

God is doing very interesting things in our discipleship. It has been a great blessing to meet weekly to study His Word and to see more people come with interest and desire to learn. Many are taking their first steps in faith, and it is exciting to observe how some have begun to grow spiritually and develop a hunger to know more of the Bible.

We especially ask for prayer for Svetlana. Although her English is limited and the discipleship is conducted in that language, she always makes the effort to attend, listen, and ask questions to better understand what we study. We pray that God continues to awaken in her an even greater desire to know Jesus and we ask for the salvation of her and her daughter.



Mother Tongue Day

A few weeks ago we celebrated a special program called “Mother Tongue Day,” with the purpose of drawing closer to the community, strengthening relationships, and making new friends. We had many languages represented at different stands. I was in charge of the Spanish stand, a language that opens doors to connect with people from many different cultures.

We ask for prayer for Tomek, a volunteer who took part in this activity and who speaks 12 languages. Although he is not yet a believer, he has shown great interest in helping with the Spanish classes. We believe God can use this friendship as an opportunity to share the message of Jesus in very special ways.



Spanish Lessons

We also give thanks to God for the Spanish classes. Our students have progressed greatly in the language, which allows us to have deeper, more meaningful conversations. Every week they understand more vocabulary and grammar, and seeing their enthusiasm and commitment is a great blessing.

Among our students are four particularly committed women: two Ukrainians, one Polish, and one Belarusian (three of them refugees). Seeing their progress fills me with hope, because learning the language is also opening doors to share Jesus with them in a closer, more personal way. We ask for prayer for wisdom to guide them spiritually and to have conversations that reflect the love and truth of Christ.



Humanitarian Aid Distribution

We give thanks to God because for more than four uninterrupted years we have been distributing humanitarian aid to thousands of people. It has been an enormous effort made possible only by God's provision so we can continue bringing help to those who need it most.

Among our volunteers is Pani Alexandra, an elderly Ukrainian refugee. Despite her advanced age, multiple surgeries, and many personal hardships, she travels nearly an hour every Tuesday to help us. Her pension is very small and she is looking for work to cover her basic needs. She helps especially with distributing second-hand clothing and has become an example of perseverance to all of us. We ask for prayer for her health, strength, and provision.

Mrs. Natalia makes simple decorations by hand, which she sells to earn a living. We've already got ours. Is anyone else interested?





Seniors Club

On Fridays we run one of my favorite ministry activities: the program for seniors. Dozens arrive very early to participate and share together. Many live with uncertainty because of changing migration policies and do not know what their next steps in this country will be. We ask for prayer that God would bring peace to their hearts and give us wise, grace-filled words to share with them each week, so they may open their hearts to the gospel and come to know our Savior.

Family Day

We also recently held a “Family Day,” where we invited several refugee families to share a special time with us. We transformed our space into a kind of free restaurant, offering food and a warm, safe environment for families who, because of their situation, rarely get to enjoy moments like this. More than a meal, we wanted to give them rest, dignity, and a space where they could disconnect for a while from the burdens and worries they face daily.



Residency in Poland for Roberto

Earlier this year, we were able to apply for permanent residency permit for Roberto. We submitted all documents and had our first visit in the immigration office in March. We should get the final decision by the end of September if there are no delays to the process. Please pray for favor and a positive decision.

Timo

Timo is our sunshine. He is a very joyful and social baby. He is learning to walk and has already 13 teeth – quite an impressive number for a 17 month old. Timo loves to eat everything, except for avocado. His favourite toys are books, followed by balls, animals and cars. Recently his favourite activity is “vacuuming” the floor. He found a spatula in the kitchen that is now his vacuum cleaner.



Roberto's health

Please pray for Roberto's health. Some of you know that he has been diagnosed with severe sleep apnea last year and needs to sleep with a special machine that helps him breathe at night. Unfortunately, we discovered recently that he needs to have a surgery to his nose to help him breathe better. Praise God the surgery will be covered by the health insurance, but we need to wait a lot for an appointment. Please pray for Roberto, for God's healing touch. Please also pray that the surgery would be possible before the end of this year.
